Welcome to Adventures in English – where learning English is fun

Experts from Cambridge University Press & Assessment have collaborated with Microsoft to launch a new winter-themed Minecraft world to help children learn English. Gormi's Winter Wonderland is Cambridge's second foray into using Minecraft as an English language learning resource following the success of the award-winning Adventures in English with Cambridge Episode 1.

Gormi's Winter Wonderland is designed to encourage children aged 8 and above to learn English by solving puzzles and tasks which are focussed on real-life communication skills. It's suitable for beginners at level A1 and above of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages (CEFR), the international standard of language learning ability. The in-game challenges encourage students to practise a range of new language skills that focus on new words, words in new forms, spelling, word formation, visual clues and critical thinking skills.

The game has been developed by the same Cambridge experts who produce the world's leading range of English language learning and assessment products. Gormi, a character from 2021's award-winning Adventures in English with Cambridge — Episode 1 now takes centre stage in this new adventure. Players are tasked with helping Gormi prepare for a winter party and progress through the game by solving challenges and puzzles along the way.

Alex Martin, Product Manager at Cambridge said:

'We wanted to create a compelling English language learning experience and Minecraft was the perfect platform, because it's loved by millions of children all over the world.

Gormi's Winter Wonderland presents in-game challenges that encourage children to improve their English by learning and using relevant language and real-life communication skills. Players are encouraged to process the meaning of the language they encounter and



then use it to progress through the game. It's a really fun experience that I'm sure will resonate with children and parents all over the world.'

Players are free to explore and complete the puzzles in any order they like with hints provided in 'weather reports' that can be found all around the igloo. They are encouraged to persevere and try an activity more than once in order to succeed. Alex says that children shouldn't focus too much on their mistakes:

'When learning languages it's very easy to get hung up on mistakes, but this is a necessary component of language learning. That's why throughout the game players are encouraged to try again if they fail a challenge.'




Following in the footsteps of the greats




A free speech paradox




Seizing justice

Using case studies from the colonial through to the antebellum era, Nikki Taylor strongly challenges assumptions that enslaved women only participated in covert, non-violent forms of resistance, when in fact they consistently seized justice for themselves and organised toward revolt. In *Brooding Over Bloody Revenge*, Taylor presents a window into the lives and philosophies of women who had their own ideas about justice and how to achieve it.







Through examining the battles against tobacco, junk food, and privacy, Gaia Bernstein describes the legal action we can take to pressure governments and the technology industry to redesign products and spaces to combat technology addiction in *Unwired*.

Explaining exam results

Two videos have been produced to help you explain what the results mean to teachers, parents and learners. We have a video that explains the results on Pre-A1 Starters, A1 Movers and A2 Flyers and another video that explains the results of A2 Key up to C2 Proficiency. Exam results release

All candidates receive a Statement of Results, and if they are successful in the exam they will also receive a certificate.

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic we have provided greater flexibility to our exam centres in delivering exam sessions. This increased flexibility, along with the continued impact from Covid-19, means that currently results are released later than our standard



results issue dates. Please note, this also impacts on when certificates are printed and despatched.

The Confirmation of Entry document you receive from your centre will state when your results will be released. The fastest way for your students to get their results is by registering for our free Results Service for Candidates, using the Candidate ID Number and the Secret Number on their Confirmation of Entry. As soon as their result is available, they will receive a notification email.

Results reporting

From January 2015 we started using a new way of reporting results for our exams to provide you with more detailed information about exam performance – the <u>Cambridge</u> English Scale.

The Cambridge English Scale is a range of scores used for reporting the results of Cambridge English Qualifications. It is built on our existing results reporting and years of research, and is designed to complement the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Understanding Cambridge English Qualification results



Cambridge English Qualifications provide institutions with meaningful, detailed results for applicants. Our in-depth exams encourage learners to develop their language skills. They provide a reliable indicator of language ability, reducing the risk that students' English does not match expectations. They help colleges and universities to be sure of a student's English language skills.

We have developed a <u>guide to understanding results</u> for our exams, designed for use by further and higher education institutions. It includes information about B2 First, C1 Advanced and C2 Proficiency.

NEW – Group performance reports

You can use our Online Results Service to review performance reports for your preparation centre. The reports enable registered preparation centres to see how your students performed by skill, by grade, by Cambridge English Scale score, etc., and to compare performance by year and against national and global averages. The reports cover all Cambridge English Qualifications from Pre A1 Starters to C2 Proficiency, including all of the Cambridge English Qualifications Business exams. To access the reports, log in to the Online Results Service using your preparation centre's normal log-in details, and click on the Performance Reports tab.
