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Results are in!

Results time is exciting—but it can also feel stressful for teachers, students, and parents. We've put together resources to help you understand Cambridge English exam results and explain them clearly and confidently.

Accessing results

Preparation centres can download students' results (including archived results) via the [Online Results Service](#).

If you have any access issues, please contact nramos@anglo.edu.uy.

When and how results are released

All candidates receive a **Statement of Results**, and successful candidates also receive a **certificate**.

Students can access their results fastest by registering for the free [Results Service for Candidates](#), using the **Candidate ID** and **Secret Number** on their Confirmation of Entry.

They will receive an email notification as soon as results are available.

Understanding results & performance reports

Results are reported using the [Cambridge English Scale](#), aligned to the **CEFR**, and provide detailed information about exam performance.

Preparation centres can also access **Performance Reports** through the Online Results Service to analyse results by skill, grade, and Cambridge English Scale score, and to compare performance across years as well as against national and global averages. To access the reports, log in to the [Online Results Service](#) using your preparation centre's normal log-in details, and click on the Performance Reports tab. The user guide explains how the reports work.

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Verifying results

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Enquiries and appeals: supporting fairness and transparency

Assessment plays a key role in the learning journey, and fairness and trust in results are essential. If a candidate believes that their exam result does not accurately reflect their performance, there are **formal processes in place** to review results and ensure transparency.

Candidates must **contact us immediately** if they have concerns about their results. We can then request an **Enquiry on Results** or, where appropriate, submit an **Appeal** to Cambridge English. These processes are designed to ensure that results are handled consistently, professionally, and with the highest standards of quality assurance.

It is important to note that the enquiries and appeals procedures described here **do not apply** to **Linguaskill, Teaching Qualifications, or IELTS**, as these have separate processes.

How the Enquiry on Results process works

The Enquiry on Results process has **two stages**, and **fees apply**:

Stage 1 – Administrative review

This stage checks that the exam (paper-based or digital) has been correctly processed, including the calculation of the final score. Please note that **Speaking tests cannot be reviewed**.

Stage 2 – Re-mark of Writing

This involves a full re-mark of the **Writing** paper. Stage 2 can **only be requested after Stage 1** has been completed and the outcome received.



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Example of fees for FCE, CAE and CPE

- **Stage 1:** USD 35
- **Stage 2:** USD 158

If the review results in a change to the candidate's score, the **full fee will be refunded**.

Important information

- Applications must be submitted **by specific dates depending on the exam date**.
- After a review, the result may **increase, decrease, or remain unchanged**.
- If the result changes, Cambridge will issue a **new certificate**, and the original certificate must be **securely destroyed**.

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Ensuring fairness: malpractice and statistical checks

Maintaining fairness and integrity in assessment is central to **valid, reliable exam results**. Cambridge English uses robust procedures to identify and address suspected **malpractice**—actions that could unfairly advantage or disadvantage any candidate and compromise the credibility of results.

Malpractice can be identified in a variety of ways, from observation by centre staff or examiners to **advanced statistical analyses of test responses**. These analyses examine patterns in responses and scores across candidates and test components, helping to detect irregularities that might not be obvious at first glance.

If malpractice is suspected, Cambridge English may **temporarily withhold results** while an investigation takes place, or in some cases **cancel results** entirely if it's determined that they cannot be reliably supported. This applies not only to individual candidates but, in rare cases, to an entire session if there is evidence that exam security was compromised.

The procedure for reviewing suspected malpractice is carefully structured and designed to be **consistent and fair**. Centres may be asked to provide relevant documentation, and candidates may be invited to submit a statement explaining their perspective. After all available evidence is considered, a final decision is made about whether results can be issued or must be withheld.

It's important to emphasise that fair assessment benefits everyone. These checks help ensure that certificates and scores truly reflect candidates' abilities and support confidence in qualifications among schools, employers, and higher-education institutions alike.



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If a result is permanently withheld following a malpractice investigation, candidates have the right to appeal through the **Enquiries and Appeals Procedure** via their exam centre.
